Parks with Recreation Centers

Chatsworth Park South

Devonshire St. at Valley Circle Blvd. Chatsworth
This park is temporarily closed, but the Virginia Watson Chatsworth Historical Museum and Homestead Acre remain open to visitors. For information call (818) 882-5614 or visit www.Historicalsocieties.net.



Granada Hills (Petit Park)

Chatsworth St. at Petit Ave., Granada Hills

Park Highlights: This neighborhood park is packed with amenities and resources, including a public swimming pool, BBQ pits, baseball diamond, basketball courts, grass fields with shaded areas, playground, picnic tables, tennis courts and the Granada Hills Branch Library. Mason Park

Mason Ave. at San Jose St., Chatsworth

Park Highlights: This small neighborhood park features BBQ pits, baseball diamonds, a playground, shaded grass areas with picnic tables and multi-purpose field. The recreation center has an auditorium & stage, indoor gym and child care center. **Mason Park Child Care Center:** (818) 341-9439

LAKE BALBOA / ANTHONY C. BEILENSON PARK

6330 Balboa Blvd. at Victory Blvd., Lake Balboa
This huge park complex features multiple golf courses, nature areas, parks and recreational facilities. **General info:** (818) 756-9404

Balboa Tennis Courts

Balboa Blvd. at Burbank Blvd., Lake Balboa
Park Highlights: Top-notch tennis complex with 16 courts, open 7 days, with equipment rentals, classes and tournaments. **Info:** (818) 995-6570

Lake Balboa

Balboa Blvd. between Victory Blvd. & Burbank Blvd., Lake Balboa
Park Highlights: 80-acre water recreation facility in the Sepulveda Flood Control Basin. Walking paths, 27-acre lake, fishing, boating, remote-control boating. Lifeguard Hours: 9:00 am to dusk. **Lake Info:** (818) 756-9743



Balboa Sports Center

17015 Burbank Blvd., corner of Balboa Blvd., Encino
Park Highlights: This 64-acre facility features baseball diamonds, two full outdoor basketball courts, community room, football field, 12 tennis courts, handball courts, 16 soccer fields, volleyball courts, a playground, miles of bicycle paths and the Encino Velodrome. Recreation center features indoor gym, stage, various sports & arts programs. **Info:** (818) 756-9642.

Encino Golf Course

16821 Burbank Blvd., between Balboa Blvd. & Hayvenhurst Ave. in Encino. **Highlights:**

This medium-length, 18-hole, par 72 golf course has large, wide tree-lined fairways. Offers a unique and varied layout that tests for the long hitter. Features several challenging 3 pars. The course was designed by William P. Bell & Sons in 1957. **Info:** (818) 995-1170.



Balboa Golf Course

16821 Burbank Blvd., between Balboa Blvd. & Hayvenhurst Ave. in Encino. **Highlights:**

This short-length, 18-hole, par 72 golf course has narrow tree-lined fairways, offering a real challenge for mid- to high-handicap golfers. Course was designed by William P. Bell & Sons in 1954, and lengthened by Steve Timm in 2008.

Woodley Lakes Golf Course

6331 Woodley Ave. at Victory Blvd. in Van Nuys. Wide fairways, large greens, and nine acres of water hazards. Course was designed by Ray Goates in 1975. Woodley Lakes also provides habitat to a wide variety of birds and animals. **Info:** (818) 780-6886



Northridge Park

Reseda Ave. at Devonshire St., Northridge

Park Highlights: Centrally located with baseball diamond, soccer field, tennis courts, basketball courts, playground, picnic tables, BBQ pits, public swimming pool, and Devonshire House. The recreation center has an auditorium, community room, indoor gym, child care and youth programs. **Northridge Child Care & Preschool:** (818) 349-0535

Northridge Pool

Features a waterslide, large lap pool, children & handicapped pool with wheelchair access and shaded grass area. Swimming lessons, water polo, and other programs.

Winnetka Park

Winnetka Ave. at Roscoe Blvd., Winnetka.

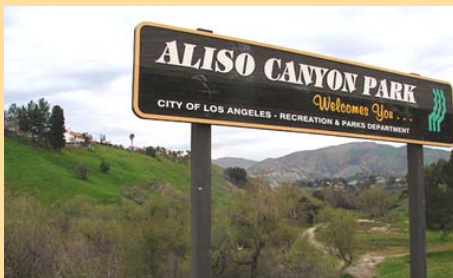
Park Highlights: This centrally located park features lighted baseball diamonds, a playground, picnic tables, shaded grass areas with trees. The recreation center features an auditorium, indoor gym, community room, child care, sports & arts programs for children & seniors, tutoring for youth. **Winnetka Child Care Center:** (818) 717-8348

Other Parks & Open Spaces

Aliso Canyon Park

Rinaldi St. at Zelzah Ave., Northridge

Park Highlights: We expanded this 69-acre natural canyon park with land acquired through Prop. K. Park offers hiking in a riparian habitat.



Bee Canyon Park

Sesnon Blvd., 2 blocks west of Balboa Blvd., Granada Hills

Park Highlights: Bridges link this spacious hillside park with natural habitat, hiking trails, picnic tables and a Neighborhood Council-funded playground.



Brown's Creek Park

Brown's Canyon Rd. north of 118 Fwy., Chatsworth

Park Highlights: This 53-acre canyon area features natural riparian habitat, oak groves, biking and hiking paths and bridle trails.

Chase Park

Chase St. at Capistrano Ave., West Hills

Park Highlights: This small neighborhood park features shaded grass areas, walking paths, a playground and picnic tables.

Chatsworth Oaks Park

Valley Circle Blvd., west of Plummer St., Chatsworth.
Park Highlights: This small park has BBQ pits, a playground, picnic tables and is adjacent to hiking areas and Chatsworth Nature Preserve.

Chatsworth Park North

Chatsworth St., two blocks west of Topanga Canyon Blvd., Chatsworth. **Park Highlights:** This large hillside park has shaded oak groves with access to hiking trails in Chatsworth's famous boulder formations, BBQ pits, lighted baseball diamonds, lighted outdoor basketball courts, a football field, a soccer field, volleyball courts, a jogging path with exercise stations, a playground, and picnic tables.



Dearborn Park

Nordhoff St. at Amestoy Ave., Northridge. **Park Highlights:** This neighborhood park has shaded grass areas, a basketball court, a playground, tennis courts and picnic tables.



Eddleston Park

Reseda Blvd. at Eddleston Dr., Northridge
Park Highlights: This undeveloped pocket hillside park features hiking trails and trees, and connects to Palisades Park, and Porter Ridge, which together provide neighborhood green space in Porter Ranch.

Holleigh Bernson Memorial Park

Porter Ranch Dr. at Sesnon Blvd., Porter Ranch.
Park Highlights: This new 14-acre neighborhood park has jogging paths, basketball courts, a playground with a Neighborhood Council-funded shade structure, grass fields, picnic tables, restrooms, and views of the San Fernando Valley.



Limekiln Canyon Park

10300 Limekiln Canyon Rd., one block north of Devonshire St., Northridge. **Park Highlights:** This small canyon has natural riparian habitat, picnic tables, bridle trail, hiking trail, and a jogging path with exercise stations.



Louise Park

Louise Ave. at Sherman Way, Lake Balboa
Park Highlights: This tree-lined neighborhood park features shaded grassy areas with BBQ pits and picnic tables, baseball diamond, basketball courts and a playground.

Nordhoff Park

Nordhoff St & Woodley Ave, North Hills. **Park Highlights:** This small neighborhood park is adjacent to Mid-Valley Regional Branch Library, and has shaded grass areas.

Moonshine Canyon Park

Sesnon Blvd. at Porter Ranch Dr., Porter Ranch (Enter from Holleigh Bernson Park) **Park Highlights:** This small canyon features walking and horse trails in a riparian habitat.

O'Melveny Park

Sesnon Blvd. at Meadowlark Ave. (four blocks west of Balboa Blvd.), Granada Hills, CA 91344
Park Highlights: This large hillside park is the second largest park in Los Angeles. Features miles of hiking trails including The Mission Trail, a scenic overlook over the San Fernando Valley, riparian habitat, large citrus groves, shaded grass areas with BBQ pits and picnic tables, jogging path.



Jesse Owens Mini Park

White Oak Ave. at Sherman Way, Reseda. **Park Highlights:** This 1.74-acre pocket park features shady grass areas and a walking path.

Palisades Park

Tampa Ave. at Braemore Rd., Porter Ranch. **Park Highlights:** This small un-developed canyon park features hiking trails in natural canyon habitat.



Parthenia Park

Parthenia St. at Canoga Ave., Canoga Park. **Park Highlights:** This small neighborhood park features shaded grass areas with picnic tables and a playground.

Porter Ridge Park

Reseda Blvd. & Sesnon Blvd., Porter Ranch **Park Highlights:** This small hillside park features walking paths, trees and shaded grass areas, a BBQ pit and picnic tables, a basketball court and playground. The park connects to Aliso Canyon Park.

Pedlow Skate Park

Victory Blvd. at Louise Ave. in Encino.

Park Highlights: This world-class skate park features 8,500 square feet of concrete skate bowls, rails, ramps and other skate features. Open from 12:00 pm to sunset Monday - Friday and 9:00 am to sunset on weekends and holidays. Safety equipment is mandatory, and can be rented on site. The park offers classes and competitions. **Info: (323) 816-6710**



Rinaldi Park

Reseda Blvd. & Rinaldi St., Porter Ranch. **Park Highlights:** We acquired this pocket park using State funds to beautify what was a blighted lot.



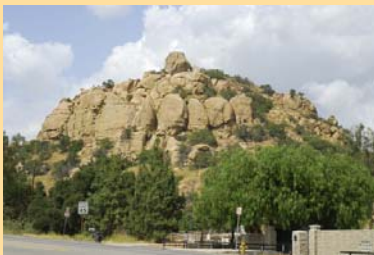
Sepulveda Basin Off-Leash Dog Park

Victory Blvd. at Louise Ave., Encino. **Park Highlights:** This dog park features a 6.5-acre off-leash area, 0.5 acre small-dog area, and an on-leash picnic area.

Stoney Point Park

Topanga Canyon Blvd., south of 118 Freeway, Chatsworth

Park Highlights: This 76-acre park is a historic cultural monument, featuring bridle paths, natural habitat, hiking trails, professional-level rock climbing, and views of the San



Fernando Valley. In 2007 we added 5 acres to Stoney Point by purchasing two adjacent equestrian properties to preserve them from being developed. The new property will ultimately be turned into a public equestrian facility with access to nearby trails.

Vanalden Park

Vanalden Ave., one block south of Nordhoff St., Northridge

Park Highlights: This small, quiet neighborhood park has shaded grass areas and picnic tables. Adjacent to Wilkinson Senior Center.



Viking Park

Viking Ave. & Nau Ave., Northridge

Park Highlights: This small, quiet hillside park features shaded grass areas with picnic tables and a playground.

Wilbur-Tampa Park

Wilbur Ave. at Tampa Ave., Northridge. **Park Highlights:** This small hillside park adjacent to Limekiln Canyon Park has shaded grass areas with picnic tables, a playground and a jogging path.

Zelzah Park

Zelzah Ave. one block north of Rinaldi St., Granada Hills

Park Highlights: This small hillside park features shaded grass areas, a playground, picnic tables and a bridle trail.
